
#### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING THE SUMMER AND FALL SEMESTER

#### 2/3 SUMMA Conference

MESA Scholars attended the 33rd Stanford University Minority Medical Alliance (SUMMA) Conference in person. They listened to inspiring speakers, participated in interactive workshops held by national experts and Stanford faculty and students, and met with iconic exhibitors. The conference provided perspective on how they will increase diversity in the health profession to better care for people of color.

### 2/8 Industry Event

We networked with industry professionals: MESA students from LRCCD came to speak on a panel to industry representatives and talk about their experiences and why companies should partner with us and provide students insight into what their job entails, mentorship opportunities, and even internships. Also had visitors from other colleges to see how to best suit transferring students.







#### 3/16 WiE Conference

The 2024 Silicon Valley Women in Engineering Conference was a jampacked day for MESA students. Keynote speakers from major companies like Synopsys and Altera gave inspiring talks. Students attended workshops covering topics in emerging technology such as Semiconductors - Empower Al, Future Trends in Robotics and Human Interaction, Generative AI - ChatGPT, and Beyond Air and Space Technologies.

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### 3/13 UC Berkeley Visit

MESA students toured the campus and visited the CAL-NERDS center for lunch. They also took a lab tour of the Scott Research Lab, a material science laboratory where high-resolution electron microscopes are used to relate the structure and function of various materials. Additionally, students went to Campbell Hall to tour the astronomy, astrophysics, and experimental physics departments.







### 4/12 Integration Bee

The Integration Bee is an annual event hosted by the math department at Sacramento City College. It is similar to a spelling bee but with integrals, an important concept in calculus. This year it was held at Sacramento City College in the Natural Sciences building, with many contestants and enticing prizes such as gift cards and an Apple iPad with Apple pen as well.
