#### All Los Rios college catalogs, including SCC's, are now available online, making it easier than ever for students to get information they need at their fingertips!

The transition to online catalogs began before our current public health crisis and

move to remote operations, but the work has accelerated in the past few weeks to ensure that we have a functional online catalog for students. Even when our current crisis is over, our students will dramatically benefit from the ability to have a more

modern and interactive catalog. Some key points worth noting about the online

• Mobile Responsive and Accessible - The online catalogs are mobile responsive, ensuring students to access it from their mobile device wherever and whenever they want (as opposed to the old PDF versions we used to have online, which were not responsive and presented accessibility challenges for students and staff).

• More Up to Date Information - By eliminating the time involved in the

printing process, our catalogs will be more accurate when the official catalog goes live each year before June 1, reducing the amount of updates necessary throughout the year (you'll note the title "Unofficial Catalog Preview," which will be in place until the "Official Catalog" is live on June 1). • **Printable Versions** - Printable PDF versions of the full catalog, or specific sections, are still available for download from the site so that students, faculty

and staff who need printed versions can access them easily. When on-campus operations have resumed, each college will be able to provide some printed

Translations - Because our websites have a translation feature, catalogs will

now be able to be translated into multiple languages for students (we

- recognize that automated translation tools are imperfect, but we've historically not had any translated versions of our catalog so this marks a substantial benefit for many students like our ESL populations). • **Spring "Update"** - There will be a catalog "update" in the Spring, serving the same purpose as addenda have historically.




