- Fewer than 10% of US college students study abroad
- Shows college admissions and employers skills such as intercultural competence, diversity, problem solving...






AIFS Student Center

- Student lounge, computer & printer access

Academics

- Courses are UC/CSU transferable

- All students enroll in the Italian Life and Culture course plus 3 additional courses for a total 12 credits

- Optional "survival Italian" course for 2 hours each week with local instructors



Italian Life & Culture Course

- Understanding the culture and society of Florence and Italy
- Experiential learning
- Lectures and corresponding field trips on history, art & architecture, politics & society, gastronomy, customs & traditions
- This 3-unit course is required for all students and is subject to college tuition fees
- Student must enroll in the Italian Life & Culture course offered by the campus that processes their program application. This class is the same class for all four schools

Housing

Student Apartments

Equipped kitchens, shared living area & full bath, Wi-Fi, washing machines

No meals are included

Approx. 15-30-minute commute to the Study Center

Typically, 4-6 students in each apartment in double rooms



Included in the Program Fee

- Shared student apartment accommodations- no meals, kitchenette, living space & bathroom, washing machine
- AIFS Student Center & Staff services including 24/7 emergency contact
- Orientation program & workshops, guided tour of Florence
- Weekly subsidized activities in Florence including visits to museums, monuments, walking tours, cooking class

Expenses not included

- Airfare: Optional group flight available or students may purchase their own flights
